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1. Introduction

1.1 Welcome to our school

Welcome to Summerseat Methodist Primary School (SMPS). It can be strange and a little daunting starting at a school and there always seems to be so many questions to ask. This booklet aims to provide you with information about Friends of SMPS, which forms a major part of school life.

1.2 Why do we have Friends OF SMPS?

Friends of SMPS is an integral part of the school community. In its time, Friends has raised thousands of pounds, which has been spent on equipment and resources to enhance our children's education experience and the school's facilities.

However, Friends is about much more than simply fundraising. Friends exists to provide closer links between home and school and it is an excellent way to bring staff and parents together socially in support of the school, working towards a common goal. It's fun too - just ask any of the Committee members or Friends helpers.

All parents and members of the school community are welcome to get involved, even if they only have a small amount of time available. All families are automatically members of the Friends when their child joins school.

Friends is extremely conscious of the ethos and diversity of our school, and we try very hard when organising and planning events to respect this. Not all of our events are fundraisers, we hold regular social nights out and family walks.

2. Charitable Status

Charity law requires voluntary organisations such as ours with an annual income in excess of £5,000 to register with the Charity Commission for England and Wales. As a charity we must abide by the Charity Commission rules and regulations and we are bound by a governing document referred to as our Constitution. Our Constitution sets out the rules about how we operate as Friends and how we conduct ourselves.

Being a registered charity enables the Friends of SMPS to:-

- receive charitable donations from local and national companies
- apply to grant-making charitable trusts; most charitable trusts will give grants only to groups formally recognised as charities
- receive donations made through payroll giving and company matched giving schemes.



3. Friends Of SMPS history

We can trace our Friends of SMPS history back some twenty years. Many of the people, who were committee members previously still help us out in a number of ways today, so you can see we are a very close knit community.

3.1 Links with Local Businesses

We have, over time, developed links with the local community and are always well supported by both residents and businesses, for which we are very grateful. Many of our local shops are very generous providing donations for raffle prizes, auction items, etc.

We are also extremely grateful to the local businesses who have participated in charity matched giving schemes. This has made a huge difference to our fundraising efforts.

4. Role of the Committee

Our Friends Committee consists of four officers: Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. We also have ordinary committee members to make up the full Committee.

The Committee meet on a regular basis usually once or twice per term, with smaller working groups meeting as necessary when we are planning larger events.

A list of current Friends committee members is at the back of this booklet. Updated lists are sent out each year after the AGM. If you are interested in joining the committee or would like to volunteer occasionally to suit you, please do not hesitate to talk to a member of the Committee.

Some Friends volunteers are help regularly and others help at specific events when they are able. Every little helps, so just one hour assisting at an event is invaluable

4.1 Annual General Meeting (AGM)

Our Annual General Meeting is held at the beginning of the academic year and provides an opportunity for all parents to come along and hear in more detail about the work of the Friends, the events we have run, the funds we have raised and how the money has been spent. This is the occasion when we elect our new committee members.



5. PTA UK

Friends of SMPS is a member of PTA UK, which is a national charity and membership organisation providing support and guidance for all home school associations in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Our association is one of over 13,000 members in current membership of the NCPTA. We pay an annual membership fee to PTA UK which gives us lots of member benefits including comprehensive insurance cover for all Friends run events, support and advice on running the Friends, plus fundraising ideas and good practice hints and tips. PTA UK also provides us with the opportunity to meet and communicate with other Friends/PTAs, to discuss and share experiences. We receive termly publications, and guidance to ensure our events are legal and safe. In addition, we have a valuable resource at our fingertips – www.pta.org.uk.

6. How we raise money

Like most PTAs, the majority of our funds are raised through the events that we run. Some of our most popular events are:

- Christmas Fair
- Easter Fair
- Quiz Night
- Cake Sales

There is always something going on. We always try and respond to the children's requests; it is great to see them having fun at the events or enjoying using a piece of new equipment that the Friends has donated.

We raise money in other ways too. Donations from parents are extremely important. You can donate time, money, items for sale, raffle prizes and auction lots or offers of services and skills.

6.1 Company Matched Giving

Company matched giving is very simple. Companies or businesses pledge to donate to a charity, such as ourselves, an amount of money relating to the amount that an employee(s) donates or fundraises for us. We have been helped enormously in the past by this type of donation, and there are several benefits to both the company and ourselves:

- employees' morale is boosted by having their efforts supported by their employer
- the company benefits from having charitable donations written off against taxable profits
- the company can endeavour to get publicity for their giving
- Friends benefits from receiving perhaps double what we have raised at an event.



If you think that your employer has a matched giving scheme already in operation, or if you would like some more information about charity matched giving or setting up a scheme in your workplace, please talk to one of the Friends committee members, or ask in the school office.

7. How we spend the money we raise

Following a fundraising event the money is banked straight away. It is at our Friends Committee meetings that the decisions on how to spend the money is agreed.

Usually, the Head Teacher will have a 'wish list' of items that the school would like the Friends to consider funding. Sometimes this will be as a result of the children asking for something, like wet break books and games so they can keep entertained at break times due to bad weather. At other times it will be for resources to improve a particular area of the curriculum or school environment.

The Friends funds are spent on the 'extras' that are not provided by the school's budget, thus making our children's learning experiences so much more fulfilling and exciting. Friends funds are not generally spent on improving the fabric of the school building as this is the responsibility of the school Governing Body.

We always endeavour to spend our funds in ways that will benefit all our children across all areas of the school and curriculum.

The money we raise is usually spent fairly quickly, that way, you can be sure that in supporting our school, your own child/children will feel the benefit, along with everybody else.

Of course, there have been times when we have been fundraising for a large project. In the past, we have supported the following special outdoor project: The playground area called 'Copse Corner' with all new play equipment, flooring, planting and storage.

The Friends have also bought and paid for the following:

- Computer Software and hardware (ipads)
- Coach travel for trips and theatre visits
- The new library shelving

However, whilst saving for these, we have still managed to find funds for smaller items thanks to the generous and continued support of our parents.



8. How we get information to you

Friends send out regular newsletters, which include information on forthcoming events and dates plus requests for assistance when we are planning large events. Following a Friends event, we always let you know how much was raised, and if we can, we tell you what the money will be spent on.

Friends newsletters and posters are posted on the school notice boards which are situated in the playground near the office.

We are currently trying to establish a list of parents' email addresses, so we can contact you this way. Please let the Friends Secretary have your email address if you wish to be added to our distribution list. The list is maintained by Friends who will not distribute or divulge your email address.

9. How you can get involved

There are many ways you can help and support your child through the Friends.

Offering to help before events or at other times during the year is so valuable. It doesn't matter if you can't help on a regular basis, or even if you cannot come into school. There are always jobs that can be done from home if you have half an hour to spare e.g. wrapping gifts, preparing raffle tickets etc. We really could not achieve what we do without the behind the scenes help that we receive.

If you would like to be more involved with Friends you could volunteer to be a Committee Member or you could simply support the AGM and give us your ideas for fundraising events. This is also a good time to ask questions or voice your opinion.

You can help by letting us know if you have any contacts or skills we could use, everything is potentially valuable to us.

Finally, we are always extremely grateful to receive donations as mentioned before.
