Bury Music Service

Bury music service have now resumed individual lessons in school for a range of instruments including violin and flute. A new addition for this term is guitar. Guitar students need their own guitar, which needs to be classical with nylon strings. This is available for pupils in Year Three upwards. Sessions would be held weekly in school. For parent-paid-for tuition the cost for new starters to Bury Music Service is £60 for term 1, £85 each for terms 2 & 3 and then after 1 year the fee increases to £110 per term. Children are guaranteed at least 10 lessons, but more often than not the children receive more than 10 per term.
