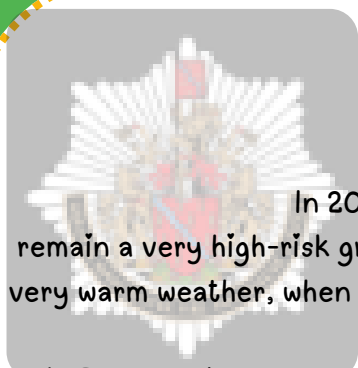

Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service (GMFRS), working with partners across Greater Manchester, are encouraging children and young people to stay safe around water, outdoors and in their communities during the school break.

In 2025, 202 people accidentally drowned in the UK, and young people aged 10 to 29 remain a very high-risk group for accidental drowning in the UK. The risk is heightened during periods of very warm weather, when young people may be more likely to go to open water to cool off or socialise with friends.

GMFRS have brought together key safety messages and information about local activities taking place during the summer holidays

Our key water safety messages

Jumping into open water can be fatal. Cold water shock kills and you do not know what is beneath the surface.

If you encourage your mates to go in the water, it could be the last time you see them.

Some open water can contain disease which could make you ill.

If you get into difficulty in the water, float to live.

Someone in trouble in the water? Remember: phone, float, throw - it could save their life. Phone 999 to get help (ask for fire if inland or coastguard if by the sea). Tell them to stay calm and float on their back.

Throw rescue equipment to help them float until the emergency services arrive.

Don't tamper with life-saving equipment or signage, they are there for everyone's safety.
