


To be secure in this unit you must:

Develop historical skills:

- Use simple stories, artefacts, pictures and online sources and databases to understand things that have happened in the past.
- Identify some of the different ways the past has been represented.
- Place events and artefacts in order on a time line.
- Label timelines with words or phrases such as: past, present, older and newer. Use dates where appropriate. Use words that show passing of time.
- Describe historical events.
- Describe significant people from the past.
- Recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.

Pioneer	A person who is the first to develop or explore.	✓ Inventors solve problems, research, plan, create prototypes, evaluate and amend designs to get a finished product.		 <p>In 1900 the brothers travelled from Ohio to Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, to begin their flight experiments.</p> <p>In 1903 the brothers built an airplane called the Wright Flyer I.</p> <p>After weeks of unsuccessful attempts, they took flight for 12 seconds on December 17, 1903, traveling 120 feet before landing. The plane worked!</p>
Inventor	A person who invents a process or device. Can be an occupation.	✓ Lots of inventions developed in the past still benefit (help) us today. Leonardo Da Vinci developed the parachute and the Wright Brothers developed the aeroplane.		
Engineer	A person who designs, builds, or maintains engines, machines, or structures.	✓ Inventors need to be creative, imaginative, good at problem-solving and determined.		
Famous	Known about by many people.	✓ The Wright Brothers discovered that longer, narrower plane wings were better for flight and modern planes are based on their designs.		
Legacy	The long-lasting impact of particular events or actions that took place in the past, or of a person's life.	✓ Amelia Earhart had many achievements, including being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean in 1932.		
Timeline	A representation of time on which key events are marked.	✓ In 1961, Yuri Gagarin was the first man in space and he orbited the Earth once.		
Past	Gone by in time.	✓ In 1969, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first people to walk on the Moon.		
Present	In a particular space now.	✓ The lives of these pioneers was very different depending on the time in which they lived.		
Future	Yet to happen.
