Consultations


This week, we have launched two consultations regarding proposed adjustments to the provision at Summerseat, We feel that both will be of great benefit to the school and community.

The first is a consultation on the proposal to amalgamate the current Summerseat Nursery (run by the Epworth Education Trust Trustees) into Summerseat Methodist Primary school, so the nursery becomes a maintained nursery rather than a privately owned nursery thus changing the lower age limit for the school from age 4 years to 3 years to be able to offer an early years unit.

The second is a consultation on establishing up to a tenplace resource base at Summerseat Methodist Primary Academy, part of Epworth Education Trust.

Healthy Snacks and Lunches

At Summerseat, we encourage our children to make the right food choices early on in order that they develop good attitudes for life. As part of this, we talk about healthy eating in assembly & in class as well as sharing the motto, 'No chocolate, crisps or sweets - save these as a special treat!' Please can you make sure your child brings in a healthy snack for morning break rather than those in the motto above. Please note however, that 'something chocolaty' can be eaten as part of a packed lunch if it is a 'pudding' following on from the main savoury part of the meal. This could be items with a chocolate covering/ chocolate chips etc. on a cake, home bake, cereal bar or biscuit. It shouldn't include confectionery items such as chocolate bars. Water bottles should be brought into class so the children can stay hydrated throughout the day - plain, unflavoured water in a reusable bottle. We also have water dispensers for the children to access

The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
- And **36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs**, also compared with 84% of regular attenders.¹

And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

 More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.²

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

• Regular school attendance can facilitate **positive peer relationships**, which is a **protective factor for mental health and wellbeing**.³
