

Taking your child/children out of school when a holiday is not authorised/requested, you may face legal action under Section 444 (1) or (1A) of the Education Act 1996 or be issued with a Penalty Notice under Section 23 of the Anti Social Behaviour Act 2003. Penalty Notices are issued per parent per child at £60 each if paid within 21 days rising to £120 each if paid within 28 days.

Reminder: World Book Day


World Book Day is Thursday 7th March. This is something we always enjoy taking part in as it supports us with one of our favourite things; reading for pleasure!

This year, we will be getting involved in the following ways:


