Children's Disability Register—Bury Council

Bury Council have requested that all families receive the following information ...

The Disabled Children's Register is a confidential list of names and basic information about children with disabilities, special or additional needs. The purpose of the register is to safeguard and promote the interests of disabled children and plan and improve services for them.

All local authorities must have a Disabled Children's Register (DCR) under the Children's Act 1989 although it is voluntary to join. It is a database of children and young people aged 0-25 years with disabilities and special educational needs. The information parent/carers and young people provide will help to assist in the planning, monitoring and development of services for disabled children/young people and their families in Bury and will enable the Local Authority to communicate all correspondence back to them more easily.

What happens to the information? The information provided will be held securely by the Local Authority until the child turns 25 years, it will then be archived. Personal details can also be removed from the register at a later date by emailing childrensdisabilityregister@bury.gov.uk

Any personal information provided will be processed in accordance with current Data Protection laws and

will be held securely and treated in the strictest confidence, in accordance with the Inclusion and SEND services privacy notice - Bury Council.

This year, we will be getting involved in the following ways:


- Inviting grownups into school from 8:45am –
