School Uniform and Dress Code

The school uniform is as follows:

School Sweatshirts or Cardigans	Green (with or without the embroidered school name)
Shirts/blouses	White tailored style or white polo shirts (with or without the school logo)
Trousers/skirts	Grey or black
P.E.	Green Hoodie (with or without the school logo)
	Green or black shorts or black joggers/leggings for winter
	White T-shirt (with or without the school logo)
Summer Dresses	Green gingham
Shorts	Tailored grey or black

All children should have trainers for PE. On PE days, children should come to school in their PE kit.

Policy Statement on Code of Dress

Rationale:

When pupils are neatly and appropriately dressed, pride in the School is encouraged.

Purposes:

- To aid corporate identity and sense of community
- To help parents avoid conflict over dress and reduce cost
- To alleviate socio-economic distinctions
- To minimise risks to health and safety

Broad Guidelines:

- It is expected that all pupils will wear the school uniform.
- Suitable footwear should be worn (trainers are not acceptable for normal classroom wear except on PE days)
- Appropriate clothing must be worn for activities such as P.E., Games, Art & Craft, swimming and for other outdoor activities. Children will not be able to take part without correct clothing.

- In the interests of safety, jewellery is not permitted (except watches – provided that owners of the bleeping variety can switch them off promptly when required to do so by a member of staff). Only stud earrings are allowed which will need to be covered or removed for PE sessions.
- Please be sensible regarding hair accessories and avoid large clips and bows. Please make sure long hair is tied back. Hair dyes should not be used.
- All school clothing (this includes vests, pants and shoes for the very young) should be clearly marked with the child's name.
